Describing the living conditions as truly third world where water sources are contaminated streams, and eating raw sugar cane results in terrible dental condition beginning in childhood, Cornette described her groups work and goals.

The group raises money to support a three-week dental program where dental professionals go to the villages and do preventive and corrective procedures as well making educational presentations in the schools. The end goal is to construct a year-round facility for use by visiting dental professionals on a rotational basis.

Optimist Club President Shari Smith presented Cornette with a check to support their mission.
